

The TYPSA Foundation's Board of Trustees is pleased to report on the Foundation's achievements, its new goals, and the resources available to achieve them. This newsletter provides information about the TYPSA Foundation's activities and highlights the importance of the contributions received to achieve its goals.

Resources in 2025



- Total budget for the year: EUR 433,891.
- TYPSA Group contributions: 0.7% of 2023 profit (EUR 284,009):
 - Monetary contributions: EUR 254,009.
 - In-kind contributions: hours of dedication by own staff valued at direct cost: EUR 30,000.
- Monetary donations from TYPSA Group employees and other supporters estimated at EUR 60,000.

Actions in 2025



1. UNILAC Project, Mahagi, D.R. Congo

- The number of students enrolled in UNILAC's Civil Engineering and Agronomy Faculties has fallen slightly compared to 2024 due to the security situation in the country following the occupation of the region by the Ugandan armed forces.
 - 462 students.
 - 215 are studying at the engineering faculties.
- The Foundation provides 50% of the cost of tuition fees for the technical faculties.
- Access to broadband internet service.
- Qualified teachers living in Mahagi thanks to the premiums granted by the Foundation with the consequent increase in the quality of education.
- Increase in qualified teaching staff through doctoral scholarships to train five UNILAC professors in the third cycle of their studies.
- The construction of the UNILAC Aula Magna is temporarily suspended due to the current situation in the country.
- Aid continues for the strengthening of the drinking water supply system with the construction of two new wells, and for the channelling of wastewater and the construction of a general septic tank.
- Collaboration between the UPM and UNILAC: three-month stays at the UPM for two UNILAC students through the Erasmus+ programme. In addition, the UPM has remote courses and master classes programmed with UNILAC.



2. Mobile Water School Project, Zambia

- Collaboration continues on the "Mobile Water School" project to train local technicians in the construction of small water supply infrastructures in western Zambia.
- Action carried out through the Spanish association TADEH (Appropriate Technologies for Human Development) and with the personal contribution of TYPSA employee Ángel Arquero.



3. Adopt a Vegetable Garden Project, Senegal

- Collaboration continues on the "Adopt a Vegetable Garden" project, for the development of water infrastructures for communities in the east of the country in the Bassari region, to improve, in an organised way, the production of horticultural products intended for self-consumption and local marketing.
- This year, two drillings have been carried out in the towns of Allinguel and Ndilicongo. This initiative is sponsored by the organisation Jakarta Africa.



4. Safe Schools Africa Project, Madagascar

- New collaboration with AMEND, an international organisation specialising in road safety aimed at vulnerable groups in developing countries. It is a pilot project to improve the safety of child pedestrians in Madagascar. Initiative promoted by the European Investment Bank (EIB) and implemented by the AMEND association in collaboration with the State Road Agency of Madagascar.



5. Alive Future Project, República Dominicana

- Financial commitment for the construction of the first building of the Secondary Education Training School in the Municipality of San Antonio de Guerra in the Dominican Republic. The project was funded by the Foundation in 2023. The action will be carried out through two contributions, one in 2025 and the other in 2026, which will cover 70% of the total cost of construction, with the rest being provided by the Carmelite Sisters of Teaching, who are the promoters of this action.



6. "Flores de Kiskeya" Project, República Dominicana

- Creation of a day care centre for single-parent children and a vocational school for refugee mothers on the border between Haiti and the Dominican Republic. On the Haitian side of the border, the necessary basic facilities already exist for the construction, towards which the TYPSA Foundation made a contribution in 2024. This year we aim to replicate this initiative on the Dominican side of the border. The action is sponsored by the "Flores de Kiskeya" Foundation.



7. Aid to those affected by the Valencia floods of November 2024

- Urgent action was taken to respond to the urgent needs of those affected by the floods in Valencia by distributing, among the affected TYPSA staff, a series of direct and in-kind aid from donations from TYPSA employees and the company itself for a total amount of EUR 154,880.
- During the first months of 2025, in-kind assistance has continued in the form of rental vehicles only for those affected who have needed it.
