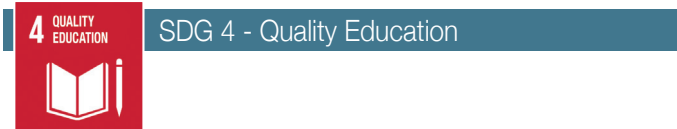


UNITED NATIONS GLOBAL COMPACT - *Best practices*

We focus on achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 4 and 17 through the TYPASA Foundation for Development, setting short-, medium- and long-term targets and indicators.



1. TARGETS WE WORK TOWARDS

Target 4.3. By 2030, ensure equal access for all women and men to quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university.

Target 4.4. By 2030, substantially increase the number of young people and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship.

Target 17.17. Encourage and promote effective public, public-private, and civil society partnerships, building on the experience and resourcing strategies of partnerships.

2. OUR COMMITMENT

Promote technical education in developing countries.

3. OUR FOCUS

Improve and maintain optimum conditions at Lake Albert University (UNILAC) in Mahagi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, for civil engineering and agricultural engineering studies.

4. OUR RESOURCES

The TYPASA Foundation for Development, created 13 years ago. Financed by monetary and other donations from TYPASA Group which together amount to 0.7% of the profit. TYPASA group employees and other institutions also donate to the Foundation. A collaboration agreement with the Polytechnic University of Madrid (UPM) has been in place since 2018 to boost economic and educational aspects.

5. TARGETS

Train young people in engineering. Provide tools for business startups that favour economic growth in the region and discourage talent emigration.

6. ACHIEVEMENTS

- Improvement of the access road linking the town of Mahagi and the University.
- Accommodation grants for 20 students from outlying areas of Mahagi.
- UNILAC outreach and promotion campaign, to facilitate access to employment for graduates, thus contributing to the development of the local community.
- Installation of exterior lighting and earthing of the roofs of all buildings.
- Repair and completion of the buildings for their official opening in 2021.
- Courses in different technical subjects recorded in French for remote learning during the COVID-19 restrictions.
- Weekly internet tutorials so that staff and students can consult UPM teachers online.

Our collaboration with UPM in the Lake Albert University project in Mahagi won the Social Responsibility and Solidarity Award 2020 from the Spanish Institution of Civil Engineers in Madrid.
